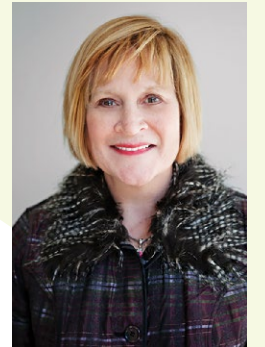

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

Thank you for making this a very successful year at Central Scholarship (CS). We are fortunate to work with a community of amazing scholarship recipients, generous donors, and dedicated volunteers. Our staff works throughout the year to identify the best scholarship candidates. I am always inspired by the abilities and tenacity of the students who receive CS scholarships. They are, in the best sense of the word, true standouts among postsecondary students.



Because of people like you who value education, we provided the following:

- Scholarships and interest-free loans totaling \$1.2 million to more than 300 students to attend career training, undergraduate, graduate and professional school.
- Generous donors created three new scholarship funds for students.
- The student debt crisis was highlighted with a \$30,000 student loan pay-down award to one student.

This year, we launched a new initiative we've named the Student Emergency Fund. There is a growing body of research that associates poverty at American colleges and its impact on college completion rates. Students often cannot afford to pay for unexpected emergencies such as medical bills or transportation expenses. These are the reasons students may miss classes or forego an entire semester. We want students to complete their degree or training program, go out into the world, and lead successful lives. We are grateful to the anonymous donor who launched this program with a generous contribution.

LAURA OPPENHEIMER GUTTMACHER
PRESIDENT 1936-1938

A Catalyst for Action

Laura Guttmacher was the President of the Central Scholarship Bureau (CSB) from 1936 to 1938. During the Great Depression of the 1930s, money was very tight and the CSB was an especially important lifeline for students. CSB leaders recounted stories about the harsh realities faced by applicants: mothers using food money for school expenses; fathers pawning items to secure education for their children, and teenagers running their households. During this time, CSB also helped students pay for “carfare and lunch.” Laura was credited with excellent financial management, having collected \$1,294 in repayments that would be redistributed as interest-free loans. In 1938, the CSB Board approved an interest-free loan of \$90.50 for a student to attend the Baltimore College of Commerce. Mrs. Guttmacher was well known in Baltimore. She was described as a philanthropist, social worker, community activist and feminist. She married Dr. Adolf Guttmacher, Rabbi at the Baltimore Hebrew Congregation. They lived in the Windsor Mill area where they raised three children: Dorothy (1894-1965) and twin sons Alan (1898-1974) and Manfred (1898-1966). While President of the Federation of Jewish Women’s Organizations of Maryland, she presided over one of many musical pieces set to fundraising goals:

TUNE: THERE’S A LONG, LONG TRAIL A-WINDING:

There’s a hard, hard week a-coming,
November eighth to fifteenth,
The Associated Charities drive for relief.
Whether Caviar or Herring,
It’s a job none can shirk!
We’ll gain our goal, if every soul
Will work, work, work.*

*It was common for Jewish organizations to incorporate musical pieces into their fundraising efforts.

The Baltimore community mourned Laura’s passing in 1966. She was remembered as a woman of outstanding character and conduct who cared for her family and community. Laura Guttmacher’s legacy is marked by her “faith in the human beings” and her determination to be helpful to others.

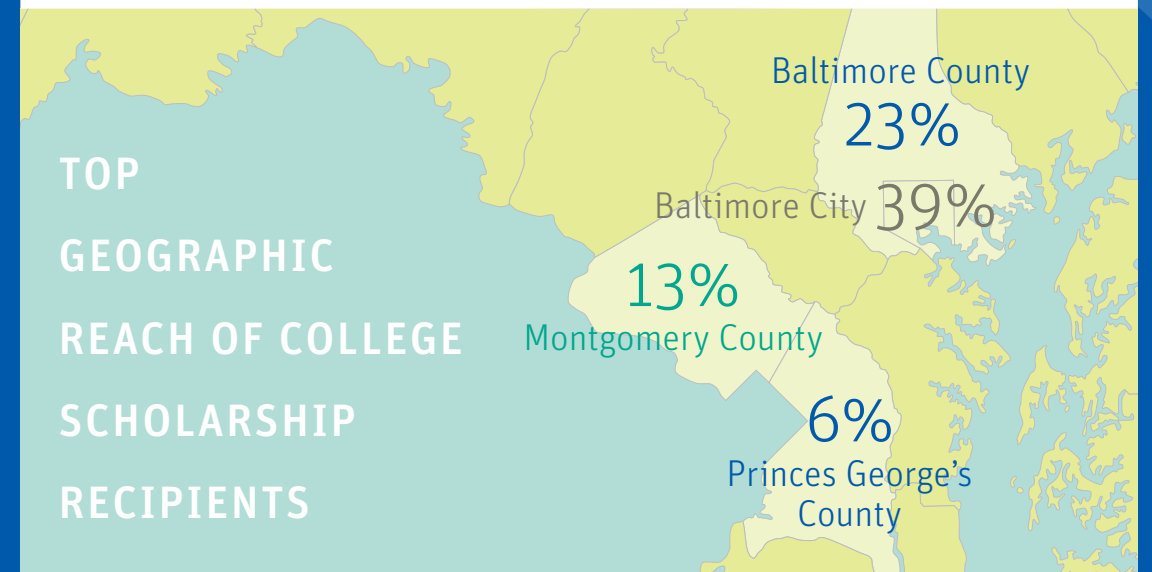

STUDENT LOAN PAY-DOWN WINNER

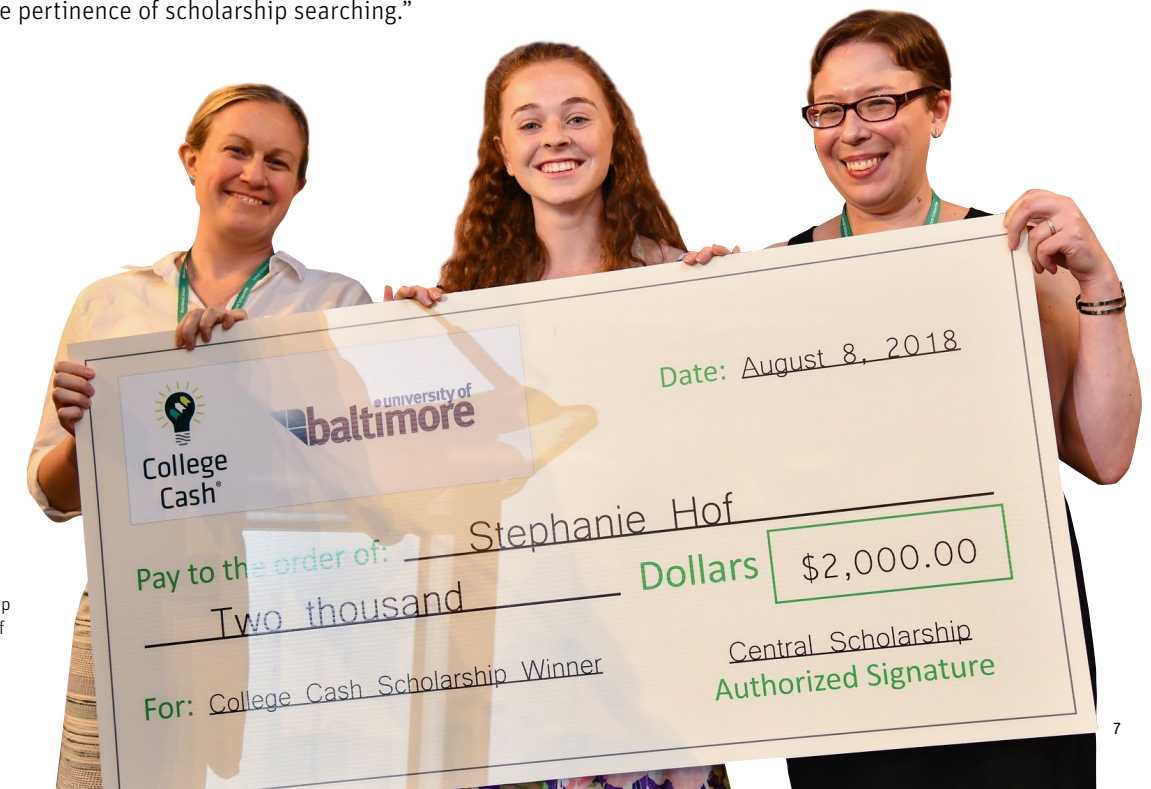

PROGRAMS TO SUPPORT STUDENTS PURSUING HIGHER EDUCATION

COLLEGE CASH®

This was our ninth year presenting our College Cash® financial education series, focused on helping students and families become more informed consumers of higher education. With the process of paying for college growing in complexity, the need for this information has never been greater.



Our staff offered six presentations to 500 students of our educational programs “Finding Money for College,” “Parents’ Guide to Finding and Funding College” and “How to Pay for College.” We were happy to present to the students and parents of Congressman Elijah Cummings Youth Program (ECYP), CollegeBound Foundation staff, students at the University of Baltimore, and with the help of a former Central Scholarship recipient, students at Morgan State University.

ADVOCACY

We continued our work as lead advocates for ending the practice of scholarship award displacement. This is the practice of displacing a student’s private scholarship award when she or he receives other financial awards. The impact is the overall reduction in financial awards provided to the student. In late 2017 we shifted our focus to protecting private scholarships earned by students attending Maryland’s private universities. In 2018, all thirteen Maryland Independent College and University Association (MICUA) members signed an agreement protecting Central Scholarship awards from scholarship award displacement at their institutions. In March 2018, we were invited to participate in a town hall discussion on scholarship award displacement sponsored by the Washington DC chapter of the Delta Sigma Theta sorority, on a panel with representatives from the United Negro College Fund and American University.



STUDENT EMERGENCY FUNDS

Recognizing a growing national acknowledgement of poverty on American college campuses, **Central Scholarship established a Student Emergency Fund** to help its scholarship recipients during times of financial hardship. The goal is to assist students so their studies are not disrupted and they can continue on the pathway to graduation. The Emergency Fund provides assistance with:

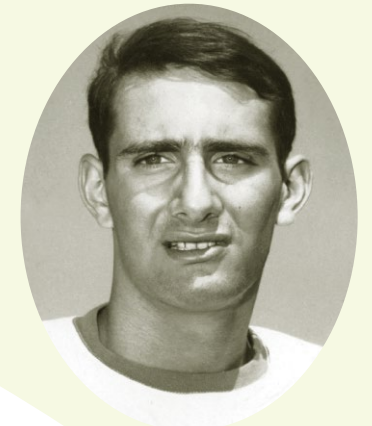


- Essential food needs
- Medications or other costs related to medical care
- Transportation needed to attend class
- Safety needs
- Replacement of essential personal belongings due to fire, theft, or natural disaster

Steven W. Sachs

Scholarship Loan Recipient, Scholar-Athlete, Business Executive, Community Leader and Philanthropist

Steven W. Sachs’ life journey reflects the determination and focus of many Central Scholarship recipients. As a young person, he was a self-starter and recognized for his keen intellect. A strong family, important mentors, and a striving personality defined his life. His family, including Steve’s father Albert, a pharmacist, shaped his early life and his mother Joline, whom he describes as always “accepting” and who also saw the potential of her son.

The Lancers Boy Club, a community service group led by the former Baltimore Circuit Judge Robert I.H. Hammerman, shaped Steve’s early life. The Lancers influenced his decision to apply for admission to The Park School of Baltimore. Steve’s mother advocated for a scholarship from Park School for her son. The scholarship was awarded, making it possible for Steve to attend the independent school. His strong showing in academics and athletics led to admission to Duke University. That is where Central Scholarship became a pivotal point in Steve’s life.

“In 1964 my aunt, Rose Sachs, connected me with Central Scholarship Bureau who provided me with a \$1,500 interest-free loan which combined with a National Defense Loan and several jobs allowed me to complete my senior year.” At the time, Duke University cost \$5,000 a year; part-time work, scholarships and loans were the only way for him to afford college. Steve was a student athlete and All-American lacrosse player at Duke. College expanded Steve’s worldview and created life-long friendships.

After college, Steve built a very successful career as an insurance risk-manager in the real estate industry. Much of

his career was shaped by the visionary leadership of James Rouse, founder of the Rouse Company, for whom Steve worked during the early part of his career. Of his outlook on life, Steve is fond of saying: “Move the pile rather than drive the pile.”

Philanthropy is also an important part of Steve’s life. He is an active philanthropist in his home base of Howard County, his alma mater Duke University and Central Scholarship (CS). Steve has been a loyal CS donor for 30-plus years. Most recently, he made the decision to include Central Scholarship in his planned giving intentions.

“While I have paid that scholarship back in multiples, I am forever grateful for the assistance and have placed Central Scholarship in my planned giving. I appreciate the work that Central Scholarship continues to do.”

For Steve, education always opened new doors of opportunities and defined the life of a young Baltimore man who sought to make the most of his life.

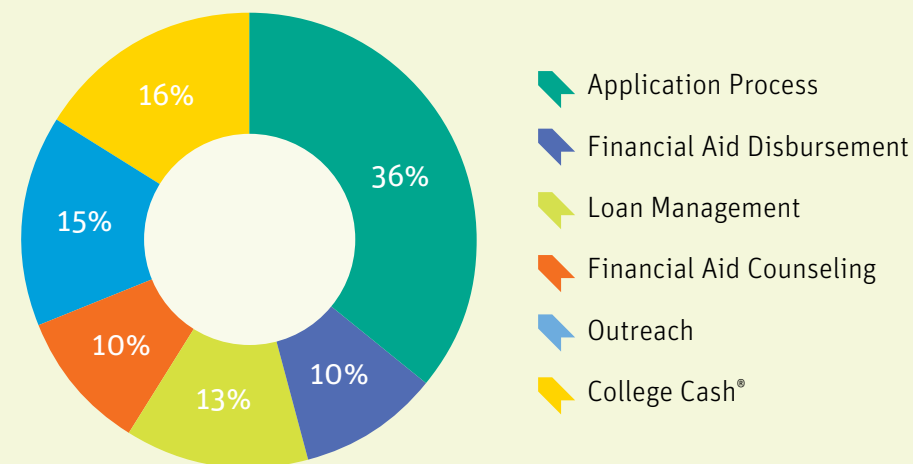
