“When I was considering options for school leading up to my graduation from Baltimore Polytechnic Institute, I was facing a difficult decision to either pursue my education with the United States Merchant Marine Academy or stay in Baltimore. My family was very supportive but couldn't afford to pay the entrance fee to the Academy. I remember feeling like following this opportunity with the Merchant Marines was essential and I did not want to pass it up. My high school counselor gave me information about Central Scholarship. Because of their financial assistance, I entered the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy in July 1970.

After graduating in 1974, I spent 12 years in the Merchant Marines. Through the program, I pursued a Bachelor's in Nautical Science and, later, a Master's degree in Business Administration. These experiences combined allowed me to become a consultant for transportation and logistics for various organizations, including the U.S. Department of Defense and the Department of Homeland Security. None of this would have been possible if I hadn't received support from Central Scholarship.

“I decided to get my CDL license because I wanted stability for myself and my family. I had been through several different programs that weren't working out. I planned for the short term to get a new job and for the long term to become a fleet manager. This was important to me for many reasons. First, I wanted to return to the driver's seat, doing what I loved. Second, the CDL license would bring me that steady, healthy income I needed.

Central Scholarship helped me find stability during a highly uncertain time in my life. I needed their financial support to help pay for my license and to stay afloat. It makes a huge difference when you know that someone is willing to help you. Only some people can make it work like I did. I'm grateful and truly blessed to have these opportunities today because of Central Scholarship.

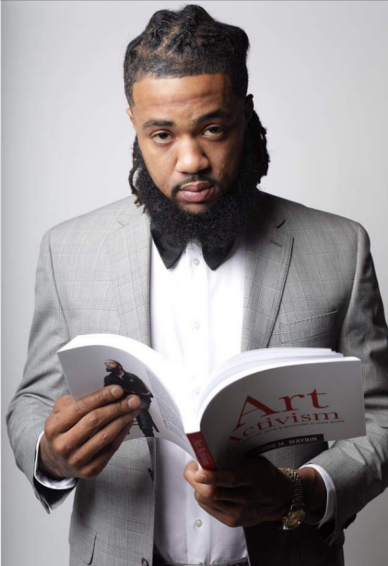

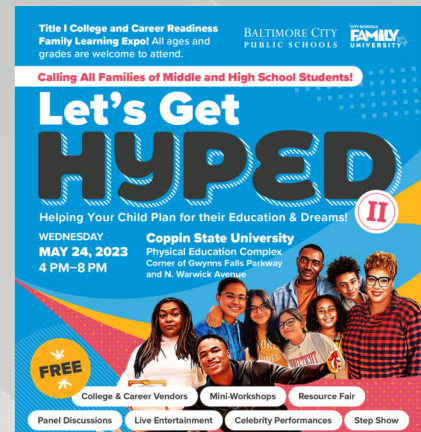
Baltimore Banner 2022-2023 **HS Athlete of The Year**

Central Scholarship had the opportunity to interview current and former presidents of Covenant Guild and discuss the historic relationship between the two organizations.

The mission of Covenant Guild is “to render service and engage in philanthropic, humanitarian, and civic endeavors.” That mission statement has been the same since Covenant Guild was founded by thirteen women in 1947.

“Central Scholarship Bureau and Covenant Guild have a long-standing relationship. Since both of our organizations have been around for over seven decades, many of the specifics about the origin of our relationship have been lost. What we do know is that Central Scholarship was one of the first educational organizations that requested to work with Covenant Guild. We’ve donated to the organization annually since 1953.

Covenant Guild established a memorial fund for members and their families at Central Scholarship. We make donations to Central Scholarship on behalf of those families. Additionally, we sell philanthropic cards to Guild members. Proceeds from cards and donations to the memorial fund are donated to Central Scholarship to benefit Covenant Guild’s President’s Remembrance Fund. This helps Central Scholarship stay in the minds of our members when they’re choosing donation recipients.

The relationship between Covenant Guild and Central Scholarship is mutually beneficial. When members donate, they receive information about recipients we helped fund; their success stories, and the difference that our scholarships made. It makes our members feel like they are part of something bigger, not just the organization donated on their behalf. Beyond the positive feelings that come from helping others, we continue to donate to Central Scholarship because we know the need is so great. When we receive student success stories from Central Scholarship, we are always impressed by the diversity of scholars and the level of study, undergraduate and beyond, that they help. Central Scholarship is one of the few organizations that we continue to support annually.”

"I remember hearing my grandmother talk about Central Scholarship. When I was growing up, my family was very active in the Baltimore-Jewish Community because we felt it was our responsibility as a successful family to serve the greater community and make the world a better place. Beyond that sentiment, the truth is, when you meet our scholars, which we do at almost every Board meeting, you get to meet people who we supported as they transformed their lives through the power of education. That is not only heartwarming, but extremely gratifying.

One of the first things I learned about Central Scholarship was about the organization's involvement in more than just collegiate scholarships. Central Scholarship also supports people's pursuit of career training, opportunities that are very hands-on, purpose driven, and transformative. This resonated with me, in no small part, because I am deeply involved with another institution that provides transformative opportunities for service for young people. These opportunities are directly integrated into their educational experiences and have inspired an enormous group of young people to engage in service throughout their lives. They have found, as I did, that integrating purpose into your life creates a positive impact for you, for others, and for an entire community. Moreover, experience has taught me that if you integrate purpose into the operation of a business, it can enhance performance, including profitability. In my view, purpose and profit enhance one another and aren't in conflict. This idea, combined with the connection I already had with Central Scholarship, was integral to my vision as I entered my tenure as Chair. We are pursuing several innovations that reflect this thinking and the innovative creativity of our new leadership and staff.

As we continue to innovate, adapt, and scale our programs, we continually find that the support we provide to our students returns the investment to our community. Our interest, as an organization, is to create the best possible outcomes for our students. This is why we continue to put so much time into becoming a repository of information for people pursuing their education. Using this time to refine those resources and expand on our impact is as important to me as any other initiative I've ever undertaken."

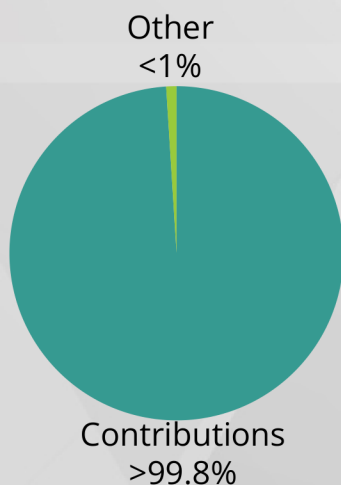

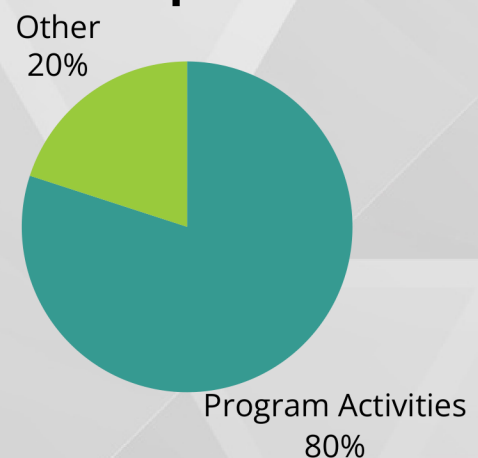
